



## Teaching Positions at the Scottish Universities' International Summer School

### Text and Context: British and Irish Literature from 1900 to the Present

The Scottish Universities' International Summer School (SUISS) is seeking to appoint a number of tutors for its Text and Context course in July and August 2016. The six-week course is comprised of three separate modules, which run for two weeks each: British and Irish Modernism (**11-22 July**), Scottish Literature 1900-present (**25 July - 5 August**), and British and Irish Contemporary Literature (**8-19 August**).

Our tutors deliver daily 2-hr seminars to undergraduate-level and postgraduate-level international students throughout a single two-week module. In addition to teaching the daily seminar, tutors attend daily morning lectures with the students and are invited to participate in the School's busy cultural and social programme. Any costs associated with the cultural and social programme are paid for by the School. Tutors are also paid to mark assessments for credit students, which are submitted by the students two weeks after the module ends.

Applications are invited from PhD students and Postdocs with experience in university teaching and some expertise in the literature that the SUISS course offers. **Applicants should be based in one of the seven SUISS-affiliated universities.** Further details about the School, as well as a list of core texts for the course and affiliated universities, are available on our website: [www.suiss.ed.ac.uk](http://www.suiss.ed.ac.uk).

Please e-mail your Curriculum Vitae (including the contact details of **two references**) and a Cover Letter to the Directors by **Monday, 1 February 2016**, to the email address listed below. The CV should clearly list all university teaching experience, including your role, the course subjects, contact hours, numbers of students, and experience of marking assessments. In the Cover Letter, please state clearly which module(s) you are applying to teach, your area of research expertise, why you would like to work for SUISS, and overview of your teaching skills and experience and what you will bring to the tutor position. We receive a high volume of applications each year, so would appreciate if the file names include your full name and the course you are applying for.

Interviews will be held at the University of Edinburgh in late February. For applicants from further afield, we can offer Skype interviews. If hired, SUISS tutors who live outside of Edinburgh will be provided with free accommodation at Pollock Halls, and weekday meals, for the duration of the module.
